

Fact Sheet: 2010-11 Student Fees

What are the annual tuition and fees at UC Davis?

Undergraduate Student fees (excluding health insurance)		
California residents	\$	11,959
Nonresidents	\$	33,980

Tuition (Educational Fee)	\$	9,402
Nonresident Supplemental Tuition	\$	22,021
Student Services Fee	\$	900
Campus-based Fees	\$	1,657

Students in professional degree programs (law, medicine, veterinary medicine, management, etc.) pay additional tuition, which varies by program. Graduate academic students pay less tuition and fees than undergraduates.

Students may also pay Course Materials and Services Fees which vary by course. Course Materials and Services Fees are charged for undergraduate courses as well as courses in the School of Medicine and the School of Veterinary Medicine. The maximum fee per undergraduate course is \$55.

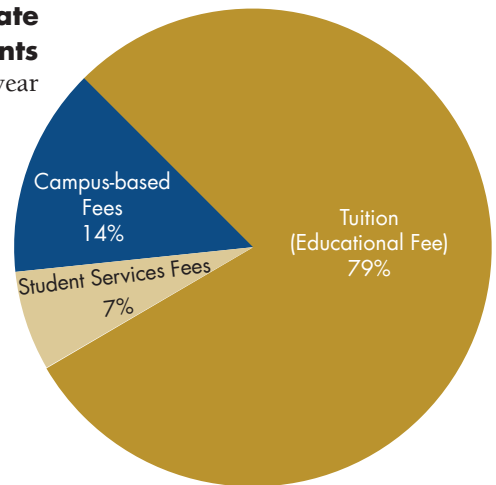
Who sets tuition and fee levels?

Systemwide tuition and fees are set by the UC Regents and are consistent across all UC campuses. Campus-based fees vary by campus. The Chancellor is authorized to establish fees such as Course Materials and Services Fee as well as user fees, deposits, administrative service charges and fees to fund life safety programs. Many campus-based fees are approved by student vote with ongoing review by student committees.

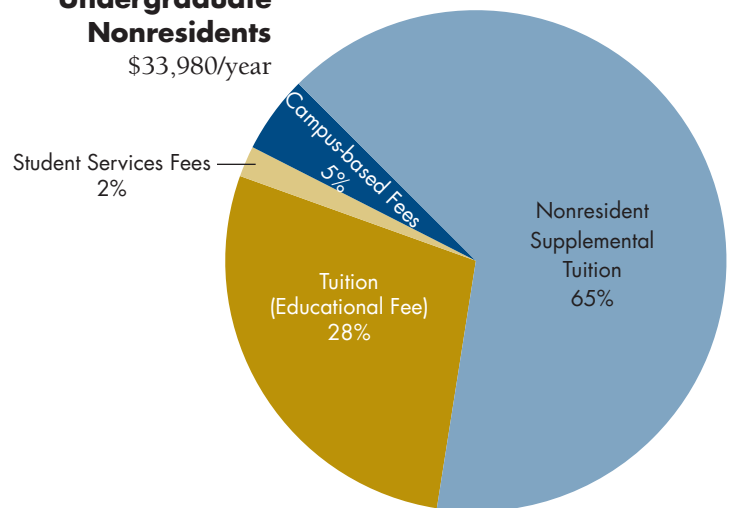
What do systemwide tuition and fees pay for?

Tuition (formerly called the "Educational Fee")	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Goes into the University of California's general operating budget, which provides funding for instructional costs as well as operating costs such as supplies and utilities. One-third of undergraduate and professional school tuition is set aside for financial aid. One-half of graduate student tuition is set aside for financial aid.
Student Services Fee (formerly called the "Registration Fee")	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provides funds to support university-provided student services, such as mental health services, Student Health Services, Student Information Systems, the Internship and Career Center, Campus Recreation, Intercollegiate Athletics, and similar services. Beginning in 2011-12, a portion of Student Services Fee will be set aside for financial aid.
Nonresident Supplemental Tuition (formerly called "Nonresident Tuition")	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Part of the campus's operating budget to fund instructional costs.
Professional Degree Supplemental Tuition	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used to support the professional school's operating budget. One-third of Professional Degree Supplemental Tuition is set aside for financial aid.

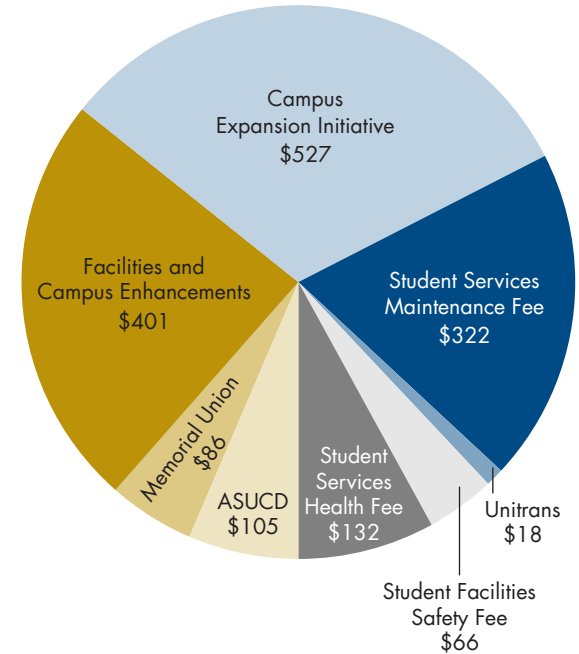
What do campus-based fees pay for?

Campus-based fees support many programs, facilities, and services for students, including financial aid. Most fees were enacted by the students. The following are UC Davis, campus-based fees for 2010-11:

What financial aid programs does the University of California offer to students?

The University has several programs to assist students with paying tuition and fees:

The Blue and Gold Opportunity Plan	Covers Tuition and Student Services Fees for qualifying California residents whose household income is less than \$70,000 per year in 2010-11 and \$80,000 per year in 2011-12. In 2010-11, over 9,000 UC Davis students qualified for this program.
Middle-Income Grants	Covers half of any fee increase amount for students with household income below \$120,000.
University Student Aid Program	Financial aid for qualifying students derived from revenue from tuition and fee increases in Tuition and the Student Services Fee.
Tuition Remission	Remits some or all of resident tuition for graduate students who have a 25 percent or more appointment as a graduate student researcher, teaching assistant, or other teaching title.
